






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Our archives paint a fascinating and incredibly detailed picture of the story of the British royal family since the end of the reign of Queen Victoria.

But perhaps even more importantly, our archives shine a spotlight on the story of the real people who, whatever their background, have shaped modern Britain


























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The first sport to feature prominently in the Daily Mirror was, perhaps surprisingly, cross country running.

Since then our focus has shifted to a slightly wider perspective, covering everything from boxing to bobsleigh.

Our collections include rare and unseen material from some of the most gripping and dynamic encounters - featuring ring legends such as Muhammad Ali and George Carpentier, Grand Prix heroes of the calibre of Stirling Moss and Juan Manuel Fangio, athletics champions such as Carl Lewis and our very own Dame Kelly Holmes . . . and of course many, many more.







Transport is about much more than simply getting from A to B, as our wonderfully in-depth archives show. Our collections cover everything from Bleriot's epic crossing of the channel, the beautiful liners that became known as the Queens of the Sea, the atmospheric elegance of the age of steam and the rise of the motorcar.

Few other archives can tell the complete story of transport from the earliest years of the 20th Century as comprehensively as ours.








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








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
